No one ventured to the round table where we normally meet.





Bob Smith is showing the wear pattern on a ring gear to Sharon.



A BLAST FROM THE PAST



This ad, running on a Gilmore Oil Co. horse-drawn gas carrier, correctly predicted that gasoline – not horses – would one day power "carriages." Standard Oil Company of New York (Socony) was one of the first users of the horse-drawn tank wagon. Socony purchased Gilmore Oil Co. in 1948 and is one of the heritage companies of today's ExxonMobil.



Standard Oil purchased one-third of Vacuum Oil in 1879; the same year, Vacuum introduced the revolutionary Gargoyle 600-W Steam Cylinder Oil. For drivers in the 1930s, the Gargoyle[™] brand emblazoned on shiny new gasoline trucks was symbolic of the Socony-Vacuum Oil Company (which eventually became Mobil Oil Corporation).




Ever heard of ESSOTM? Standard Oil Company used the brand name ESSO to market its products starting in the 1900s; ExxonMobil continues to market fuel under the ESSO brand in many countries. The truck pictured above is from the <u>Anglo American Oil Corporation</u>, the company under which ESSO started.
