
MARKING THE WAY / Main street to Meadow Lane to Park Avenue. We take navigating named roads for granted-but it wasn't always that simple. In 1912, leaders of AAA in Michigan set out to attend the Indianapolis 500. To keep the group together, the caravan's lead car dropped confetti to mark the route. Unfortunately, the wind scattered the confetti, and the cars following the wind-tossed paper trails ended up scattered as well. But the predicament sparked an idea: William Bachman, the caravan's leader, developed a system of painting colorful bands on telephone poles to mark the way to different destinations-with each route a different color. The first poses were painted three years, leading to the first route-marking system in Michigan.










How many Model 'A' enthusiasts does it take to remove a stuck gas gauge?

Central Alabama Model A Ford Club invite
