In 1948 the building was sold to the U.S Government and used a military induction center. Our own President Jim Langley was inducted Ito the USAir Force in that building. The building is still there and since 2012 has been he home to the Porcha headquarters.


Having no more business meeting was adjourned.






The Club's Planning meeting was held this month at Bobby's shop. This allowed members to attend a Swap Meet being held by the Central 'A's.


