

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
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

HERE IS A BIT OF HISTORY...

Hours after Pearl Harbor was bombed on December 7, 1941, the Secret Service found themselves in a bind.

President Franklin D. Roosevelt was to give his Day of Infamy speech to Congress on Monday, and although the trip from the White House to Capitol Hill was short, agents were not sure how to transport him safely.

At the time, Federal Law prohibited buying any cars that cost more than \$750, so they would have to get clearance from Congress to do that, and nobody had time for that.

One of the Secret Service members, however, discovered that the US Treasury had seized the bulletproof car that mobster Al Capone owned when he was sent to jail in 1931.

They cleaned it, made sure it was running perfectly and had it ready for the President the next day.

Al Capone's 1928 Cadillac V-8 "Al Capone" Town Sedan became the President's Limo in December 1941.



Mechanics are said to have cleaned and checked each feature of the Caddy well into the night of December 7th, to make sure that it would run properly the next day for the Commander in Chief.

And run properly it did. It had been painted black and green to look identical to Chicago's police cars at the time.

To top it off, the gangster's 1928 Cadillac Town Sedan had 3,000 pounds of armor and inch-thick bulletproof windows.



It also had a specially installed siren and flashing lights hidden behind the grille, along with a police scanner radio.

The "Rides" in my life since 1964

I finally decided I would dig out some old pictures & scan them to show the "rides" in my life!

I learned to drive in 4th grade in a 3-speed jeep, I think it was the type

that was used in WWII. The brakes went out on me once on the ranch when I was driving downhill through the wine grapes & I quickly turned the car to the left & was able to stop.



My very first car I got was when I turned 16 in 1971. We lived in Santa Rosa on a 50-acre ranch & my dad was either a manager of a car lot or a salesman at Ellis Brooks Chevrolet in San Francisco. He got this 1967 Chevy II from an elderly man in San Francisco & gave it to me. My Dad had it painted sunburst blue. I sold it in 1982 when I was leaving the country to go to Sudan, Africa for two years with Wycliffe Bible Translators as a bookkeeper.

My second car I got in 1984 was a 1967 Dodge Dart, three on the tree. I was the second owner & there was a name plate in the car with the first owner's name on it. He had to sell it because he couldn't drive anymore & had to get an automatic car for his wife to drive. I think that car cost me \$900. I gave it to a girlfriend in 1989 when I left for Kenya, Africa to work at the Rift Valley Academy in Kijabe, which Africa Inland Mission ran. No picture of that car!

My third car was a 1984 Chevy Camaro with a T-top. I was the second owner on this car that some friends at church sold to me for \$3000 if I remember rightly. It was black when I borrowed it during a trip stateside for about a month in 1982 when I broke my tibia at the joint & had to be flown home for surgery. I had the Camaro painted a Corvette color of such a light blue it looked white. I can't remember the name of the color now. Years later I sold that car to Truett's daughter Cindi who was keeping for when one of her sons turned 16. It ended up that the insurance cost too much for a teenager with that

car, so they sold the car!

I had a Toyota Corolla when I lived in Kenya, but I can't find a picture of it! We drove on the left side of the road & it was a stick shift. I adjusted quite easily to driving on the left!

We had a Crown Victoria (like the one below left) for a while and then

a F150 crew cab pickup that was one of my favorites!

I got my Lady Drives a Model A driver's license at the National Meet in Addison, Texas. Truett's brother Kenneth taught me how to drive his A before I took the test!

We now have a 2014 Toyota Tacoma, a 1931 Town Sedan & a 1931 Model A Pickup.

Stormy, American Saddlebred Sandy, a Quarterhorse Park Lights (Porky), a Thoroughbred I did own a Honda 175 motorcycle (no picture) for a few years. I sold that when I left for Sudan. I've always enjoyed riding, but I did have an accident in Sudan on one of the compound's Honda 80's when I went through some very thick loose dirt/sand & went off the bike, chipped a bone on my tibia & had a concussion.

And one of my main modes of transportation continues to be my bike! The photo below right is of one that I rode in Sudan! It was how I rode to the market or to the UN pool to swim laps! There were only six miles of paved rode there in Juba at the time!

My current ride below which I do a lot of grocery shopping on!




P.S. I took auto mechanics one quarter at Cal Poly so I knew how to work on most of my cars!
