

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




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MODEL A TINKER TIME SHOP

DID YOU KNOW

In August of 1931 Ford introduced the first all steel automobile body, even though it was for a closed cab pickup truck. This was the first production all steel body in automobile history. The body was produced only by the Budd Body Company and it was identical to the cloth top cab except that the top was all steel with corresponding steel top ribs.

The Budd Body Company of Philadelphia was a major supplier of cars, airplanes and train body works. They were innovators in all types of metal work and a leader in the use of stainless steel.

In 1929 the Budd Body Company attempted to intise Ford into a contract by creating several all steel Fordor Model A sedans. They were labeled Model G-2. It did not materialize as a Ford product possibly because it was not Henry's idea. Like several other ideas.

This prototype was a bit radical for a Model A body, being a little larger and a having a different frame and suspension, among other small differences. One of the original prototypes has survived and is owned by Terry Hutchins.

There is a very good article about the history of this car, by Douglas Skinner of Charleston, South Carolina, in Volume 68, number 3 in the May-June 2020 issue of "Model A News, the magazine of the Model A Restorers Club.
