

## **TECH TIP**

The next time you remove your Model A's oil pan, try this first. Get four 5/16" 19 T bolts; cut off the heads of the bolts, then saw a slot in the sawed off end to fit a screw driver. Next, screw the four bolts (now slotted studs) into the four corners of the block; use a good adhesive to coat the pan gasket, then position using the stud as guides. Install several side bolts to secure the pan, remove the studs with a screwdriver and replace with pan bolts. Another good idea is to replace the rear pan bolts that are hard to reach with a socket wrench, with oval slotted oval head bolts. This makes it a lot easier to install. Rather than the original bolts, by all means USE NEW BOLTS. You would be amazed how much tension used bolts lose. Be careful not to over tighten the pan bolts and flatten the gasket too much resulting in leakage. Dry torque for SAE grade 2 bolts should be - 11 ft lbs, grade 5 – 17 ft lbs; SAE grade 8 – 25 ft lbs...
