River Cities Model A Ford Club Meeting Minutes August 18, 2011

Opening:

The regular meeting of The River Cities Model A Ford Club was called to order at 6:00 pm on August 18, 2011 at the Woodman of The World Lodge by President Al Lugo. He then led the group in The Pledge of Allegiance. The blessing was given by Jim Timbes and all proceeded to the buffet.

Approval of Minutes:

A motion was made by John Robertson to accept the minutes as written in the newsletter. Bob Smith seconded it.

The minutes of the previous meeting were unanimously approved as written in the newsletter by show of hands.

Treasurers Report:

The treasurer's report was read by Bettie Jackson. Bob Smith made a motion to approve the treasurer's report. Bill Shirley seconded the motion and the members unanimously approved by a show of hands.

Program:

Al Lugo presented a DVD he acquired by loan from the MAFCA called "The GAZ Model A" We learned the last Model A was produced in 1950 in Russia. Henry Ford had set up a partnership/contract with the USSR in 1924. The film showed many interesting pictures of Model A's and Model AA's having been adapted to the needs of the USSR. The GAZ factory was one of which produced these vehicles. Afterwards we heard from Howard Ruddick who spoke on how important it is to check your car's belts as he recently experienced a breakage. He passed around an example of a new belt (Kevlar) he was able to acquire and shared with us where we could find these. In addition he proudly displayed a coffee cup his wife recently made for him with pictures of his Model A "Chief" on it. Joe Spooner also spoke on the importance of checking your fan blades carefully to ensure that there are no crakes especially near the shaft. With the help of Buddy Graves he discovered that his fan blade actually had bolts on it such that he was able to remove the blade to replace them.

Old Business:

The website is getting off to a great start! We have had over 200 hits over the last 2 months. There will be some new sections on the web site such as posting of the Scholarship Bi-laws and a listing called Awards. Bill Shirley encouraged the members to submit pictures of their cars to increase our photo gallery. The sponsors have been

notified of the new website and how much more exposure their adds are getting now. Al reported on the success of the last tour to the GA Model A Swap & Cofer Collection. 9 members were able to attend and had a great tie. Many pictures were taken.

New Business:

Al remarked that he was able to acquire the use of the microphone from the Woodsman of the World Lodge to use at our meetings. It worked well to broadcast the speakers. The club survey will be presented at the next club meeting. A request has been made by the Brookside Glen facility to have our cars on display in their parking lot like we did last year. The day is Sept. 23. Please thin about participating and let the group know for sure next meeting. Two letters received by the club were read by Al. A sincere expression of thanks for of the outpouring of support to the Morris family on the passing of Edlow was read written by Mrs. Morris. Another letter of thanks was read from MAFFCA expressing their thanks for the clubs contribution for a brick for the Ford Museum. Both were given to the historian to put in our scrapbook. From the last board meeting it was discussed a possibility to arrange for 3 persons to receive the scholarship this year. Mickey Timbes made a motion that Victoria, Kyle and Robin who have submitted their applications and have met the requirements for consideration receive the scholarships individually. Bobbie Penny seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by a show of hands. The next Board meeting will be at the Burger King on Wynnton Road Sept 2, 2011 at 9a. All persons are welcome. There have been some changes in the celebration ceremony for the club in recognition of the International Model A. It still will be held Sept 10, 2011 but instead will be a tour of the town with a stop at the Infantry Museum. We need you to sign up for this right away. Other car shows that are coming up are: Oct1, 2011 the LaGrange Car Show and the Buena Vista Show Oct 29, 2011. The next workshop in October "Brakes according to Henry Ford" has been postponed to Oct 15 and will be held at Al Lugo's garage. Bill Buck reminded the members of the upcoming Steeplechase on Nov 5, 2011 and asked folks to be ready to sign up for this by next meeting. He also reminded the group that the Easter Seals is having a pancake breakfast this Saturday on Double Churches road from 7a-11a. The program for next month will be Paul Singer: Cooling systems and the presentation of the scholarship awards. 
Adjournment:


