Opening:

Approval of Minutes:

A motion by Bob Smith to approve the minutes as they appeared in the newsletter for last month's meeting was made. The motion was seconded by Steve Carslie. The motion passed unanimously by as show of hands.

Some of the items included, engine gasket, books on various cars, repair manual for Model A, a 1931 Alabama tag, an alternator, a fleece throw, Model A tools and many other items, The auction proved fun and exciting raising a total of \$625 which include the \$150 we had already raised

as a club. Bettie will be sending the Model A Ford a check for a brick to honor the club.



New Source of information for our Model A's

Bentley Bohanan of Bentley's Antique Auto Service has agreed to provide Service/tech tips in our news letter. The following is the first of many. Starting next month we will be restoring a Model A.

Model A Q&A

By Bentley Bohanan

I hope everyone is well and getting those Model A's out for a drive. The shop has been super busy. Here are some questions from Phone calls to the shop this month.

Q: My Model A goes dead when coming to a stop sign, especially if it is on the down hill side.

A: I find that adding an extra gasket under the float valve will usually help. This lowers the carb float, so that gas does not slosh out of the cap jet and flood the engine when stopping. You will have to remove the bottom of the carb, then remove the float, the valve, and add an extra gasket. The seam on the float should be tilted downwards slightly when the valve is pushed closed with finger tip pressure on the float. If you have a leaky carb, this will be a good time to replace that valve, and check all your jets to make sure they are not loose or cracked.

Q: My fuse keeps blowing on the Model A, especially at night.

A: This is usually caused by the contacts in your headlight bulbs getting against the side of the light socket. Remove your bulbs, and cut some small pieces of craft-paper about 3/8" x 7/8". Roll this strip into a circle and slide it into the light socket. This will create an insulator for the contacts, so they don't short against the side.

Q: Weren't all Model A's originally Black? Why are y'all painting all the cars in so many different colors?

A: Model A's were originally advertised as being "All the Colors of the Rainbow". The "all-black" myth apparently comes from so many "T" Models being produced in black. Most Model A's did have black fenders, but the bodies were usually two-toned, or even three-toned. We have lots of original paint color chips to go through if you are considering painting your car.

Q: My ammeter seems to work backwards. It goes to "Charge" when I turn on the lights, and "discharge" when I rev up the engine.

A: Sounds like you just need to switch the leads on the back of the ammeter. The yellow with the black tracer usually goes to the right.
