September Program: "How we got Here" The History of the Model A Ford Club of America.....

Woody Wagon

Ford's first attempt at mass producing a true 'dual purpose' vehicle came in 1929 with the introduction of the Model 'A' Station Wagon. Designated as the type 150-A, the unique design could accommodate up to eight passengers with baggage, or reconfigured to carry cargo by removing the three rear seats.

The wooden bodies for the Station Wagon were assembled at both the Murray body and Baker Raulang Companies from subassemblies supplied by Ford. Finished assemblies were then mated with the chassis on Ford's own production line. Bodies were constructed of hard or soft maple, paneled with birch plywood. Spar varnish was applied to completed bodies to protect the wood.

Exterior color selection on the Wagon was limited to Manila Brown, with the remaining structural metal finished in Black.

Floyd Bennett Field, NY – A giant twin-motored Upperou-Burnelli Plane, Piloted by Lou Reichers, yesterday carried aloft a Ford car and its driver Zeke Meyer, from Floyd Bennett Airport. When the plane had reached an altitude of more than a mile, the driver startyed the motor of the car to test its starting ability fwhine in the upper spaces. This photo shows the plane in flight with the plane slung underneath it.

Ford of Japan

Ford established a manufacturing facility in the port city of Yokohama in February 1925, where Model T vehicles were assembled using imported knock-down kits. The factory subsequently produced 10,000 Model A's up to 1936. Production ceased in 1940 as a result of political tensions between Japan and the United States.


After World War II, Ford did not have a presence in Japan, as the Ford facility was appropriated by the Japanese Government until 1958, when property was returned as a possession of the Ford Motor Company and became a research and development location for Ford partner Mazda. In 1979, Ford acquired a 24.5% ownership stake in Mazda, and in 1982 Ford and Mazda jointly established a sales channel to sell Ford products in Japan.

Some Tips for your Model-A:

- Your coolant should be a finger length below the radiator neck.
- Point the rotor toward you before you pull out the distributor.
- A business card or a straighted paper clip is about right for point gap.
- A sliced potatoe rubbed on the windshield acts as a water repellant.
- A strand of screen wire will clean a carburetor jet.
- A tin can will make a good rear axle shim.
- A thin dime will set your spark plug gap.
- Vinegar or warm soda makes a good battery post cleaner.

The First Assembly

The first land vehicles actually assembled in the Rouge were not cars but farm tractors. No sooner had Henry Ford achieved low-cost transportation with the Model T than he set his sights on doing the same for the world's farmers. In 1921 production of the world's first mass-produced tractor, the Fordson, was transferred from the original Dearborn plant to the Rouge.

Ford put a mammoth power plant into operation in 1920 that furnished all the Rouge's electricity and one-third of the Highland Park Plant's needs as well. At times, surplus Rouge power was even sold to Detroit Edison Company.

An innovative glass plant began operation in 1923. Utilizing a continuous process that Ford had helped develop, it produced higher quality glass at lower cost. In 1928 the Model A became the first low-priced car to use laminated safety glass. By 1930 the Ford was making its own safety glass at the Rouge.

The Rouge achieved the distinction of automotive "ore to assembly" in 1927 with the long-awaited introduction of the Model A. Building B would be the home of assembly operations from that time forth.

The Rouge also is home to legendary products, such as the V-8, the first Mercury, the 1949 Ford and the original Ford Thunderbird, and is the only place where the Ford Mustang has been produced for nearly 40 years
