

I CAN'T PROVE IT. BUT YOU CAN'T DISPROVE IT......

As many of you know, I travel middle Georgia frequently. Last fall, I was headed to Thomaston for business reasons and as always seeking new adventures on the "back roads." Near Pleasant Hill, I came upon a Model A Roadster stopped on the roadside with the hood open. An old timer in farmers' coveralls was working on the engine which had overheated due to a broken fan belt. He introduced himself as Frank Johnston and his wife, sitting in the car as Margaret. "This is the only car I have ever had" Frank Said. Bought her in 1930 and kept it all these years. Like me, she is getting old, but neither of us is over the hill yet. Tomorrow, ole Charlie Williams over in Chalybeate Springs will fix my leaky water pump and install a new fan belt, and this old girl will be as good as new again. Certain that Frank would be able to get the Ford home; I parted company and drove on to Thomaston. I asked an old friend; Gary who had ran a repair shop for many years and knew everyone, if he knew Frank Johnston? He did not, but he did know Charlie Williams in Chalybeate Springs who also had repaired cars for many years. The next time I went to Thomaston, my friend Elmer rode along, and we stopped in Chalybeate Springs at Charlie Williams shop. Charlie was working on an old tractor, but was quite willing to stop and talk. When I asked if Frank Johnston had been in to get his new fan belt, a funny look came over his face as if he had just seen a ghost. His answer was a real shocker. "Frank ain't coming here, or going anyplace else, he has been dead for some thirty years." He then told this story.

Frank and Molly lived on a farm over near Sprewell Bluff and only owned one car, a 1930 Ford Roadster. One day near Hendricks and about two miles from their home, a young boy on a bicycle veered into Frank's cars path. He swerved to miss the boy and went over the bluff into the Flint River. Frank was killed; Margaret survived and later moved to Macon with a daughter. The farm was abandoned. I changed the subject by asking if he still had any old car parts, and in looking around he found a new Ford fan belt. "Here, take it." "I will not need it now." As we got back in my truck, Elmer asked, "Did you see the tag on the belt?" I was amazed when I read, "For Frank Johnston," written on the tag. More bewildered than ever, we visited the old farm which was a lonely place, and in poor repair. Elmer suggested that we

leave the fan belt for the ghost of Frank Johnston, and we placed it on a peg near the front door. Once back home, I decided to forget about this, since no one would believe me anyway. But the Ghost of Frank Johnston was not done with me. Later I received a phone call from an excited Elmer who lives near Woodland. A few days after out visit, he and another friend rode bicycles to the Johnston place, and much to his surprise, the fan belt had vanished. Recently, a road construction crew had dug up the remains of an old Ford Roadster near a Flint River bridge. Not much of the car was left, most everything was rusted or gone, except for the fan belt, which appeared to be new.....


