170-B Deluxe Fordor Production Information

Prior to the introduction of the slant windshield models in April 1931, there were six different two-window fordor models. All of these fordor bodies were built and supplied by Briggs Manufacturing of Detroit, Michigan.

The first of these models was the 60-A Leather Back introduced in mid 1928. It was distinguished by a brown artificial leather top extending down the rear quarters to the belt rail. With the introduction of the 1929 models, it was replaced by the 60-B. The 60-B was the same body, trimmed with black long-short grain artificial leather top material.

In early 1929 the 60-C Steel Back version of the same body was added. In mid 1929, with production of the larger Town Sedan body in full swing, Briggs managed a change from the 60-C to a new *Two Window* model based on the larger Town Sedan body. The new model was also a standard model and was designated the 170-A.

In 1930 the Two Window fordor was fitted with the new cowl assembly and redesignated the 170-B. In April 1930 the Briggs body Two Window fordor underwent it's final change. It became the Deluxe Fordor sedan or 170-B Deluxe. It was trimmed nearly identical to the Town Sedan and remained unchanged until replaced by the slant windshield models.

Statistics

The Deluxe Fordor was produced for a twelve month period between April 1930 and April 1931. A mere 13,594 were produced between the two model years.*

40-B Deluxe Roadster

The History

The open models were consistently popular for Ford. By mid 1930 however, sales of the open models were dropping rapidly. In an effort to increase demand, Ford introduced the Deluxe Phaeton in late June 1930 and followed with the Deluxe Roadster in late July.

The Deluxe Roadster was priced at \$520. Differences included a shorter windshield, finished in chrome plate. An all new top assembly was used. It featured varnished natural oak bows and was trimmed in tan drab (light olive) fabric. The new interior trim included dark tan Bedouin grain genuine leather seating surfaces with matching artificial leather throughout the interior, and the floor covering was brown carpet. The seat was lowered approximately one inch to adapt to the lower profile (the seating drop was subsequently applied to the standard roadster).

The exterior was enhanced by the addition of a left side mounted spare tire. At the rear of the car, a chrome luggage rack with oak finished steel slats and full-length rear bumper were added. To add more contrast, the wheels were painted to match the stripe.

In early 1931 the spare tire was moved to rear. The left side mounted spare, luggage rack, and special bumper were no longer included as standard equipment. They could however, be special ordered at extra cost and installed at the branch during assembly. The base price was reduced to \$475.

Statistics

During the five months the Deluxe Roadster was available in 1930, 11,313 units were produced. In 1931 the Deluxe Roadster nearly replaced the Standard Roadster with 52,997 deluxe units produced(U.S.).*


One of the most successful advertising campaigns in America was for Burma-Shave shaving cream. Report on the June MATTS (Model 'A' Tinker Time Shop) get together.

We met at Bobby's shop for coffee, donuts, Model A shop info, and fellowship.

As usual Bobby had lots of parts to look at. This month's parts included a flywheel housing, an exhaust manifold, and two distributor housings. All these parts had cracks. We also looked at a pair of front wheel bearings. When dissembling a Model A, Bobby had found metal chips in the lubricating grease of these bearings. These metal chips had ruined these bearings! Keep bearings clean when handling.

We discussed how to replace a Model A fan belt. The original Ford specification is for a 42-7/8" belt length. A Kevlar core belt 44" long is available for Model As running alternators. This belt P/N 28-24695-1 is available from Mac's Auto Parts and is tough.

Come join us on the first Friday of each month at Bobby's shop. The coffee is hot, the donuts good, and we always learn something.


