"THE PASSING OF THE "FOUNDING FATHER OF OUR MODEL A CLUB"

It is with extreme sadness that we report the passing of Jim Timbes, who I consider the "Founding Father" of the River Cities Model "A" Ford Club.

Almost 14 years ago several owners of Model "A"s in Columbus and Alabama often talked about the possibility of forming a local Model "A" Club. It was Jim who took the initiative to call a meeting of the local Model "A" owners on November 16, 2000. This meeting took place at the Burger King on Wynton Road, and on that day our club was founded. When we talked about who will be selected as our first Club President it was obvious that Jim would be that person, becoming our first President, a challenge that he willingly accepted.

Eleven founding members and later others, after obtaining a Charter from the Model A For Club of America, worked hard that year, under Jim's able direction to form what is today the River Cities Model A Ford Club. In 2009 when no one wanted to accept the Presidency challenge, seeing the club in danger of folding, he again accepted the challenge and served as President from 2009-2010.

Many times when a monetary contribution was needed for a project, Jim and Mickey, would with no publicity, make that donation for the betterment of our Club. They were always instrumental in the many affairs of this great club.

I always remember how much Jim and Mickey enjoyed the Tri City Christmas Parade. Many times Jim would dress as a "Character of the 30's" and during the parade would get out of his Cabriolet, walk around his car, giving candy to the many children watching the colorful parade. This was a great way to connect with the future collectors of our beloved classic.

We always say that behind a great man there is always a great woman. We can never forget the many contributions that Mickey did helping Jim in the formation of our Club, serving in many club leadership positions and also serving later as President of the club from 2003-2004. Thank you Mickey for all you and Jim did for the club, and please accept our deepest sympathy for Jim's passing.

With Jim's departure from earth, I am sure he is now in Heaven, probably talking with Henry Ford, thanking him for giving us our beloved Model "A" Ford and telling him how much he enjoyed the ride. Jim, Thank you for all you did for the River Cities Model A Ford Club. We will never forget you...



THE FORD COMMERCIAL CAR A & AA 1928 -1931

Part Two By: Jim Langley

A Number of derivatives of the 300 Delux Panel were available soon after February, 1931, among them was the 270A Funeral Service Car available with/without side windows starting at \$1550. Standard equipment included casket rollers, side window covers, if needed, a removable flower tray, black leather seats, stainless steel trim and cowl lamps as well as chrome bumpers, front and rear. Although there are Ford Archive pictures of a proto-type with disc wheels all of the 17 270A's built featured steel spoke wheels.

Much more popular, and more expensive, was the type 275A funeral coach priced at \$1900. This is a four-door derivative of the 300A. Standard equipment included casket rollers with special flooring to hold the casket in place, removable center pillars for side loading, and green mohair upholstery. A total of 96 275A's were built including three with a combination Ambulance option offered at \$1950.





Introduced at the same time was the 1931 type 280A Ambulance. This unit used the Briggs-sourced side-door body shell of the 275A Funeral Car. The Triples safety glass \$1700 dedicated Ambulance included a glass partition, 2 attendant folding seats, and white lacquered rear compartment with built-in dome lights, heater and fan. Standard emergency equipment cocnsisted of a medicine chest, folding stretcher, cot. Fixed bed with two mattersses, rubberized side curtains and folding rear steps. Ford Motor Cofmpany Archives revealed that not all of the 84 280A vehicles were used as ambulances. One was delivered to mid-west bandleader Red Wilson and his Zenith Rhythm Kins as a tour bus....



An additional Delux Panel truck derivative was the type 285A Deluxe Police Patrol. A 2 door body priced at \$1250. The companion truck, the \$975, 290A Standard Police Patrol was adapted from an entirely different body shell, the Murray-built type 85B Panel Delivery.


Proctor-Keefe reworked Briggs-built ford 300A Deluxe Panel truck bodies for specialized service. One such conversion was the small Briggs-based insuled body that included locker type foors for transporting meat and other perishables. Proctor-Keefe also offered special light weight oversized van bodies serving as furniture moving vans and other municipal bodies including ambulances, hearses, service cars and small buses.



Finally Ford introduced a longer wheelbase Model AA chassis on June 9, 1930. The 157" chassis, which eliminated the need for aftermarket slip-on frames or cut-frame extensions proved very popular with freight haulers and movers.

In review, one must conclude that Ford furnished chassis wity cowl, hood, radiator shell, headlamps and front fenders to many other body building shops

to build specialized bodies on both the Model A and Model AA Ford Chassis including Wood, Galion, Omaha, and Baker-Raulang to name a few.


