Members met on another chilly morning at Bobby's shop. The wood burning stove was a popular hit, as was the hot coffee.



We learned the importance of adequately grounding the battery to the frame. Ground wires must be copper size 1 or larger. To insure the engine is grounded a Size 1 wire is also attached from the frame to an existing bolt on top of the transmission housing. These ground wires can be obtained from local auto houses. Ford also used the frame to ground lights and accessories. It is important that each accessory is fully grounded to the frame and is not insulated from the frame by paint.

A battery tender is recommended to keep the battery charged when the Model A is in storage. Battery tenders are available with either 6 or 12 Volt output.



Four piston assemblies with connecting rods with babbitt bearing were displayed. These bearings had failed. The rods were replaced with new connecting rods with inserted bearings.





Model A Q&A'S April 2015

It's time to get those Model A ready for the road. I got to go for a nice ride in my 1928 Roadster Pickup last Saturday, and it really gave me the fever. Lots of people are getting their cars out for the first time, and calling in with questions. Here are some questions from the last few weeks.

Q: It seems like my Model A gets a little tighter every year. The distance between the steering wheel and the seat keeps getting shorter. Is there an easy way to move the seat back to gain more room?

A: I agree, people must have been much smaller back then. The Model A is a snug fit for people these days. However, depending on your body style, you may have some options. On Tudor Sedans, it's pretty easy to move the drivers seat back several inches. You can purchase a kit from Mike's A Fordable Parts, A47904 Seat Adjuster. This bolts in place of your regular seat brackets. On most Fordors and Coupes, you can gain a few inches by moving the seat frame further back in the car. We can also install a Seat Slider kit for you, which makes it super easy to adjust the seat. Some early Fordors have the seat bolted to the sides of the car, this makes it a little more tricky, but it can done. If you have a Roadster or Pheaton, you are pretty much stuck with what you have, however, we have had some luck reupholstering you seat to make it slimmer to gain a little more room.

Q: How do I know when it's time to put new tires on my Model A? My tires and plenty of tread, but they are starting to crack on the sidewalls.

A: You have answered your own question. If the tires are starting to crack. Then they definitely need to be replaced. Most Model A's are never driven enough to wear the tires smooth, many still have tires from the 1960s or 1970s, holding air and still being driven. However, the rubber has long since outlived its usefulness. Once the tires crack, then moisture is allowed to get to the fabric belts inside the tire casing. It won't be long before the belts start to break down, and the tire will fail. A good rule of thumb is to replace the tires every 10 years. This is probably beyond the manufacturer's recommendations, but that's better than running 30-year-old tires.

Q: The Vacuum windshield wiper on my 1930 Tudor sedan does not work. How can I repair this?

A: First check to make sure you have vacuum going to the wiper motor when the car is running. Remove the hose from the unit and use your thumb to feel for a strong vacuum. Unfortunately rebuild kits for these motors are no longer available, but sometimes you can repair them by disassembling them carefully, lubricating the seals with petroleum jelly and reassembling them. We keep rebuilt original vacuum motors in stock, if you need one. The next option is to convert to an electric windshield wipers. This requires running a power wire in place of the vacuum line. Try to mount the electric motor, so that it does not interfere with the windshield actuation. This is not original, so try to avoid drilling extra holes in the car if you can help it.
