

Shown here is Bobby checking the level and flatness of an exhaust manifold.




Larry Farr brought a disassembled water pump for us to see.


Various cutting tools were demonstrated by Howard. Always wear the proper safety equipment when using these tools.




A pneumatic nibbler is shown here cutting thin gage sheet metal. The nibbler was the fastest cutting tool.




A rotary grinder with a 3" x .062" cutoff wheel.













LETTERS FROM HOME...

SERVICE LETTER # 2 February 15, 1928 Floorboard Battery Box

Cover We refer you to the front floorboard and the metal plate A35150. We have decided that the hole in the cover is not necessary and
due to possibility of battery fumes escaping through this hole into the
passenger compartment. We (FMC Engineering) have eliminated this
hole in all cars now in production. Please check your demonstrator and
if yours does have the hole, we will be happy to ship you the new type
immediately. Do not fail to let us have this information immediately...

Front Body Mount Bolts The front body bolts are left out intentionally on all Tudors and Coupes and immediately will be eliminated on the Fordor. The elimination of these bolts will assist with flexibility of the models on twisting and rutted roads. The elimination of these bolts has no effect upon body to frame mounting...

Paint Color Change Service Letter # 9 August 15. 1928

We have discontinued the Copra Drab with Seal Brown mouldings and French Gray Stripe for the Fordor body. These colors are being replaced in assembly by Rose Beige for the body, windshield and window reveals with Seal Brown mouldings and an Orange stripe. We are also adapting Andalusite Blue for bodies, windshield frame and window reveals with Arabian Sand Dark for mouldings and an Orange stripe...

<u>Hubcaps</u> In assembling Hub Caps part number All30 to the wheel, we crimp four of the lugs on the inside of the wheel to prevent the hubcap from coming loose...

DID YOU KNOW?

The Ford Motor Company has one of the richest histories of any Automobile Company. This was possible because of the preservation of documents, photos, and short films. It is my purpose in the coming months to bring you significant facts of Ford history presented in short "bullets". Please join me in honoring the rich Ford Motor Company History.

1928 Martin-Parry Depot Hack


 When we talked previously about Ford Model "A" Station Wagons we said that Ford built production Model "A" Station Wagons from 1929 to 1931. We also said Ford built 5 prototypes Model A Station Wagons in 1928.

- In 1928 Ford built 42,612 commercial chassis. Many of these chassis were converted to many different uses. One of these conversions was the Martin-Parry body seen above.
- The Martin-Parry Company incorporated May 26, 1919, purchasing stocks from the Martin
 Truck and body corporation in Pennsylvania and the Parry Manufacturing Company of
 Indianapolis. It later had its facilities in Pennsylvania, Indiana and Mississippi and built bodies
 for all the different Marques including Ford Motor Company.
- As we mentioned in a previous "Did You Know" article the Depot Hack evolved from the Express body when they added seats.
- The need for a Depot Hack came from the need to transport passengers in small numbers from the Train Depot outside of the city to the city. The Train Depot later gave way to the Train Station, thus the name Station Wagon.
- The Martin-Parry Company was sold in 1930 to General Motors to build commercial bodies for the Chevrolet Truck Department; because of this no more Martin-Parry bodies were built after 1930.
- As far as we know there are only 2 Martin-Parry Model A built Depot Hacks known to exist. This
 makes the Martin-Parry Depot Hack a very rare Model "A". The above example is body
 Number 218 and was completely restored using the original body wood as a pattern. The date
 on the Cowl is 10/10/28.
- It was purchased November 2010 in California. Originally sold as part of an estate sale in Pennsylvania in January 2008. The estate sale advertised it incorrectly as a "1929 Model A".




Another Martin-Parry Depot Hack ...
