Meeting adjourned. Respectfully submitted,


































DID YOU KNOW?

The Ford Motor Company has one of the richest histories of any Automobile Company. This was possible because of the preservation of documents, photos, and short films. It is my purpose in the coming months to bring you significant facts of Ford history presented in short "bullets". Please join me in honoring our rich Ford Motor Company History.

William (Billy) Hughson- Henry Ford's First Dealer

- It is said that Billy Hughson did not even know what an automobile was when he met Henry Ford at a bicycle show in Chicago in 1902.
- Hughson was born in Buffalo, N.Y. in 1869 and later went to San Francisco seeking to make his
 fortune. At the time he met Ford, he was the Head of Hughson & Merton machinery parts
 Supply Company. He attended the Chicago Bicycle Show searching for new products for his
 company.

- Ford was attending the bicycle show to demonstrate his Quadrycycle and look for possible dealers. Ford thought Billy Hughson would make a good dealer in his part of the country.
- Hughson in turn was of the idea that a motor carriage was a good item to sell as a bicycle.
 After meeting Ford he shook hands and agreed to purchase \$5,000 worth of the automobiles that Ford would soon produce.
- Six months later he traveled to Detroit with the 5,000 dollars and was able to attend on June 16, 1903 the formation ceremonies of the Ford Motor Company. Since Ford had not built any other cars yet he offered Hughson the opportunity to invest the \$5,000 in Ford's new company. After talking to his partners in San Francisco they decided to pass on this opportunity that later proved to be a great economic mistake since an investment of \$5,000 then could have been worth many million dollars later.
- With the \$5,000 Hughson purchased twelve of the automobiles Ford will soon build. This made William Billy Hughson the first official Ford Dealer.
- After Hughson took possession of the cars they sat at his warehouse for 3 years without selling any of the vehicles. One of the reasons was the bad roads around San Francisco and also that most of the public thought that automobiles were toys for rich people. In 1906 San Francisco suffered a major earthquake that left the city in need of help. Hughson donated six of these automobiles to the Red Cross for ambulance work. His other six cars and his office were destroyed during the earthquake. The Red Cross used them since these vehicles could travel were a horse could not travel or were a horse was afraid of traveling.
- For his contribution during this disaster a US Army General, General Funston, who was in charge of reconstruction, made sure that Hughson's dealership office was the first business rebuilt in the Market Street.
- After the earthquake, with the visibility of his cars used by the Red Cross, his business picked up in San Francisco and he was then called Mr. Ford Dealer around the city. By then the public knew the automobile was much more than a rich person's toy.
- Since he was the first dealer, his west coast territory included California, Oregon, Washington, Alaska and Hawaii. It is said that at one time there were 120 dealerships that were traced to Hughson.
- Later Hughson found Ford's 999 race car in a Santa Monica junk shop bought it and restored it and presented it to Henry Ford as a gift for his museum.
- William Billy Hughson died at the age of 100 and the oldest ford dealership closed 10 years later.




One of the first 1903 Ford sold in San Francisco. A representative of the company is behind the wheel of the car...


