

Bobby presented a timing gear that clearly showed the depression on the gear that would match what we found when we timed our ignitions.

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
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DID YOU KNOW?

The Ford Motor Company has one of the richest histories of any Automobile Company. This was possible because of the preservation of documents, photos, and short films. It is my purpose in the coming months to bring you significant facts of Ford history presented in short "bullets". Please join me in honoring our rich Ford Motor Company History.

HENRY FORD II



- Henry Ford II is also known as "HF2", as "Hank the Deuce" and as "Henry the Second". He was the oldest son of Edsel Ford and the oldest grandson of Henry Ford. When his dad Edsel died in May 1943 Henry Ford II was serving in the Navy.
- Henry Ford had re-assumed the Presidency of the Ford Motor Company. By this
 time Henry Ford was not consistent mentally and it was felt that he was not fit for
 the job. During this period the company had 600 million in cash but was losing
 over 10 million dollars a month. It has been said that the administration of
 President Franklin D. Roosevelt, worried about the war production at Ford, even
 considered a government takeover of the company.
- Henry Ford II joined the Navy in 1941, receiving an ensign's commission and was
 assigned to do administrative work at the Great Lakes Naval Training Center,
 near Chicago. He left the Navy in July of 1943, joining the Ford management
 team a few weeks later. He was asked to leave the Navy to help run the Ford
 factories by Bill Knudson who headed the mobilization effort of American industry
 during the war. Knudson, a General at the time, was worried about Ford Motor
 Company's contribution to the war under the leadership of the elder Henry Ford.
- In September of 1945 he became the President of Ford Motor Company at the age of 28 when the 82 year old Henry Ford resigned from Ford Motor Company. HF2 had seized control of the company backed by his mother and his wife who threatened to sell her stock in Ford, which was family owned, if her son was not given control of the company. He was President of Ford Motor Company from 1945 to 1960 and CEO from 1945 to 1979.
- When he became President the company was in turmoil, the European Factories
 had suffered a lot of damage and domestic sales were in decline. He
 immediately went to work, first firing Harry Bennett, who was the head of the Ford
 Service Department and the cause of much of the turmoil and hiring good men
 and listening to their advice. Within a few months he terminated or demoted or
 transferred over a thousand employees. Most of these were Bennett's cronies.
- Knowing he was inexperienced, he hired some seasoned executives like Ernest Breech and Lewis Crusoe, executives from the Bendix Corporation. Breech served as Henry Ford II's mentor and the Breech and Crusoe team became the core of HF2 business expertise.
- Also HF2 hired ten Officers from an Army Air Force statistical team, which will be known as the "Whiz Kids". Some of these later served in key positions in the Ford Motor Company. The "Whiz Kids" were later also known as the design team for the 1949 Ford which re-established Ford as a formidable automobile Company.

Ford had 100,000 orders for the 1949 Ford the day it was introduced to the market.

- HF2 is credited with also helping to revitalize Detroit and the surrounding communities. He made Ford departments cost-accountable, bringing the company out of the red. By 1950 Ford was restored to second place in the auto industry.
- In 1956, under Henry Ford II, Ford Motor Company became a publicly traded corporation, raising 650 million dollars for the Company. It was structured so that the family maintained control of the company.
- Later the company lost about 325 million dollars in the Edsel car. But during his
 tenure the company had great success with the creation of the Thunderbird and
 later the Mustang. He later was instrumental in expanding Ford business overseas
 establishing Ford as a major power in Europe and other overseas markets.
- During the early 1960's HF2 tried to buy Ferrari from Enzo Ferrari. HF2 wanted to
 expand the Ford presence in motorsports including the Le Mans 24 hour race.
 After the deal failed, HF2 started the Ford GT40 project, with the objective of
 ending Ferrari's influence at Le Mans. After difficult years in 64 and 65, in 1966
 GT40's won at the Daytona 24 Hours and the Sebring 12 Hours race and winning
 during the next four years at Le Mans.
- He was never able to achieve his greatest goal, to beat General Motors and become number one again, but in 1986 Ford reported profits of 3.3 billion to GM's 2.95 billion. It was the first time since 1924 that Ford had top GM on profits.
- HF2 desire to keep his power brought him into conflict with his aides just like his grandfather. The Ford Motor Company was his life and his kingdom. Anyone that challenged him was let go.
- Henry Ford II was said to be very candid and honest. He always took responsibility for his decisions. He was known for his deeds and his integrity. He mended relations with the Jewish community. He later received the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai Br'rith American Award in 1980.
- The President of the United Automobile Workers union named Mr. Henry Ford II as one of the most influential and colorful figures in the auto industry. During HF2

tenure at Ford, the UAW was able through negotiations, to introduce new concepts at Ford that later set industry wide standards.

- Henry Ford II retired from all positions at Ford Motor Company when he reached
 the age of 65, the mandatory retirement at Ford Motor Company. By the time he
 retired as chairman in 1980, Ford Motor Company was the fourth largest industrial
 corporations in the world.
- When asked why he work so hard at Ford Motor Company or to settle an argument he would always say "I had to, my name is on the building".
- It is said that even after his retirement, he remained as the ultimate source of authority at Ford. HF2 died in 1987 at the age of 70 from pneumonia at the Henry Ford Hospital. He died exactly 30 years after his grandmother, Clara Ford at the same hospital.
- Henry Ford II was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by President Lyndon Johnson in 1969. In 1983 he was inducted into the Automobile Hall of Fame. He was also later inducted into the Junior Achievement U. S. Business Hall of Fame in 1996.
- In 1996, the Ford Moto Company renamed its World Headquarters complex the Henry Ford II World Center an installed a bronze statue of him in the lobby.


