

The Model A offered buyers elegant styling (described as a "downsized Lincoln" by some), four-wheel brakes, improved fuel economy, a laminated safety glass windshield, hydraulic shock absorbers, and a 200.5-cu.in. four-cylinder engine rated at 40 horsepower, enough to deliver a top speed of 65 MPH. Seven body types were offered at launch, including Sport Coupe, Coupe, Roadster, Phaeton,


Tudor sedan, Fordor sedan, and truck, and buyers could choose from four colors (Niagara Blue, Arabian Sand, Dawn Gray and Gun Metal Blue).



DID YOU KNOW?



The Ford Motor Company has one of the richest histories of any Automobile Company. This was possible because of the preservation of documents, photos, and short films. It is my purpose in the coming months to bring you significant facts of Ford history presented in short "bullets". Please join me in honoring our rich Ford Motor Company History.





- Last month we talked about a rare Model A, the Model "A" Ford Mail Truck. Even rarer is the 1931 Deluxe Pickup. Only 293 of these pickups were produced and only about 23 still exist and half of them are in running condition.
- In late 1930 the AA Service Car was produced. On May 1, 1931, Ford Motor Company announced a smaller version of this Service Car and called it the Deluxe Pickup.
- It was first developed by Ford Motor Company for use by the General Electric Company. Ford first introduced the Deluxe Pickup at the General Electric Refrigerator Dealers Convention in 1931. General Electric ordered 125 units and chose white for their Deluxe Pickups. These Pickups were also available in the other 38 standard commercial colors.
- The bodies were built by Briggs Manufacturing Company and after they applied primer to the bodies, they shipped the bodies to the Ford Assembly plants for paint and assembly.
- These bodies were mounted on regular Model "A" chassis, regular four cylinder engine and were only available with a standard closed cab. It is believed that all Deluxe Pickups had indented cowls since production started May 1,1931
- The bed was longer, had deeper sides, and had a tailgate that opened the full width of the body and opened lower to make loading easier. The tailgate had hardware that was unique to this pickup. The Deluxe Pickup had a straight windshield and the running boards were the same as all commercial vehicles.
- Ford advertised the Deluxe Pickup as been well adapted for many businesses including electrical companies, service stations and garages, tire dealers, parts delivery companies, hardware merchants, grocery stores and public utilities
- While standard Ford Model A Pickups had standard trim (black), the Deluxe
 Pickup had rustless steel in the radiator shell, cowl band, headlights, windshield
 frame, tail lights, and outside rear view mirror. They came with single sidemounts.
 The Cowl lights and the rails mounted on top of the bed were chrome plated.
- By September of 1931 only 99 units had been sold. Ford Motor Company initially ordered 325 units but because of this Ford Motor Company canceled its contract with Briggs after only 293 Deluxe Pickup were produced.
